From 2008 he began a collaboration as a performer and playwright for the Petrillo Dance Company for which he writes and interprets "La pelle del popolo nudo", Medea Carnedellamiacarne, Oneplusoneequalsone.

With his work with the Osm company he obtains the National Showcase of the author's dance Anticorpi at the Ammutinamenti festival in 2010, he is Semifinalist at the Scenario Award in 2011 and finalist in Naples in Fringe in 2012.
